


HOW SOOT KILLS



Soot pollution, a dangerous mix of metals and chemicals, is released from sources like coal plants and vehicle exhaust.



Soot particles are so tiny that they bypass our natural ability to expel larger particles with a cough or sneeze.



When soot particles are inhaled, they lodge deep in the lungs and enter the bloodstream, leading to heart attacks, cancer and even death.

The EPA's updated standard will make our air safer to breathe and save 15,000 lives annually.
